# **SECURE YOUR VAN AND TOOLS**

In September, we saw a rise in the reports of thefts from vans and commercial vehicles. Thieves will target trade vans to steal hand and power tools. Please consider:

-Upgrading the security on your van and fit an independent alarm.

-Fitting additional locks on your van doors as some manufacturer's locks can be picked, which will disable the alarm.

-Installing a quality tool chest and secure it with a padlock,

-Marking your tools so they are easily identifiable as belonging to you. Some ways to mark your property include engraving and forensic marking.

-Registering your tools with the UK property register – Immobilise <u>www.immobilise.com</u> and keep an up-to-date list of all your tools, including photographs and serial numbers.

# Park In a well-Ilt area at night Remove high value tools when left unattended Ensure vans are secured with alarms and good quality locks Don't leave anything on display

# WARNING: it is illegal to ride e-scooters on public land and you must stop immediately

We understand that e-scooters can be considered a fun and convenient way to get around, but currently you are not allowed to use them on public land.

It is illegal to ride them on pavements, cycle lanes, beach promenades, bridleways or any publicly accessible land, including parks or car parks.

E-scooters can only be used on private land with the permission of the landowner.

A Government trial is currently underway around approved rental of e-scooters. Until the legislation is changed, individuals could face a fine and penalty points on their driving licence, and the scooter may be impounded.

# **E-SCOOTERS**

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles. This means they are treated as vehicles and have to keep to the same legal requirements.

The Police can issue a warning, can seize your e-scooter and the rider may also be liable for prosecution or traffic offences.

## **DVLA TEXT SCAMS**

Thousands of motorists are targeted each year by fake text messages that promise vehicle tax refunds and other false services. Here are a few to watch out for ...

DVLA FINAL REQUEST TEXT SCAM: This scam will include words such as 'action required' or 'final request' along with a link, which will be to a scam website.

DVLA VEHICLE TAX REFUND TEXT SCAM: This scam text says the DVLA has been trying to contact you and you need to contact them via the link provided in the text.

DVLA FAILED PAYMENT EMAIL SCAM: This will often have a subject line stating that your latest vehicle tax has failed, and it may contain an ID number. It may say the payment has failed because your billing details have changed or expired. There will be a link provided where you can update your details and it may also threaten you with a fine of up to £1,000 if you don't pay what you owe.

WHAT TO DO IF YOU'VE CLICKED ON A LINK: If you suspect a link to be fake, don't enter any information. If you have entered any information into the link, contact your bank or card provider immediately. You should also report any scam texts you get to the Police via the Action Fraud website.


